Accessibility: By Air: Owen Roberts International Airport is near George Town on Grand Cayman and is the main airport. Why Choose Cayman Islands? With an average income of around KYD\$47,000, Caymanians have the highest standard of living in the Caribbean; its GDP per capita is the 14th highest in the world. The Cayman Islands is one of the most well-known tax havens in the world. Unlike most countries, the Cayman Islands does not have a corporate tax, making it an ideal place for multinational corporations to base subsidiary entities. With no direct taxation, the islands are a thriving offshore financial center, and have the fifth largest banking sector in the world, with assets equal to 1/15 of the \$30 trillion total. The Cayman Islands boasts almost 300 banks and leading global financial institutions, accountancy practices and offshore law firms. A stock exchange was opened in 1997. The economy is also fueled by tourism, shipping and real estate.

Citizen Investor Program: There are a number of options for foreign nationals simply wishing to have the right to reside in the Cayman Islands. In particular, one can apply to the Chief Immigration Officer for a Residency Certificate which is valid for 25 years and is renewable.
